

Hry asks multispecialty hosps to keep 20% of beds for EWS

Those Built On Subsidised Land Told To Offer Free Care Of Up To ₹5L

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Gurgaon: At private hospitals that were given government land on subsidised rates, patients from economically weaker sections (EWS) can now get admission under reserved beds and free treatment that costs up to Rs 5 lakh.

Multispecialty hospitals that received Haryana Shahari Vikas Pradhikaran (HSVP) land have to earmark 20% of the beds for EWS patients with annual family income up to Rs 1.8 lakh, as part of measures to make private healthcare more affordable and accessible to the poor. In Gurgaon, this direction would apply to Medanta, Fortis and Artemis — among the city's most prominent hospitals that treat around 2,000 patients daily.

Other private hospitals, which also got subsidised HSVP land, have to reserve 10% of the beds for EWS patients. For those admitted under this policy, treatment up to Rs 5 lakh will not be charged. EWS patients will



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have to pay 10% if the bill amount is between Rs 5 lakh and 10 lakh, and 30% if the bill is more than Rs 10 lakh.

The state government on December 8 revised the Policy For Providing Free Treatment to Poor Patients. Before this, multispecialty hospitals could charge EWS patients 30% of their regular fee besides providing free OPD services to 20% of such patients.

To monitor the system, the hospitals have been told to upload details of all EWS admitted patients admitted on the HSVP portal. "After the portal is created, as soon as the patient belonging to BPL or poor family is admitted

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in the hospital, his/her details have to be uploaded. A copy of the final bill will also have to be uploaded," said Gurgaon chief medical officer Virender Yadav.

Patients who belong to families with annual earnings up to Rs 1.8 lakh are eligible to get reserved beds and treatment at subsidised costs. Those who want to avail this will have to give proof of their state residency and EWS category with BPL card, Aadhaar card, Parivar Pechan Patra or Ayushman Bharat within 24 hours of admission.

According to the notification, private hospitals that got government land have to also

set up a separate medical store for the sale of affordable generic drugs. Beds will be earmarked for EWS categories but if lying vacant, the hospitals can admit patients from general categories. In case all beds are being used, the hospital administration will still need to make arrangements to admit the EWS patient.

The three multispecialty hospitals in Gurgaon confirmed that they were informed about the changes on Wednesday. "We have asked for 10 days' time to set up a separate counter (for EWS patients) and to make some changes for the payment method," said Dr Anjali Kaul, medical superintendent, Artemis Hospital.

Together, Artemis, Medanta and Fortis-Gurgaon gave benefits under the earlier policy to 650 EWS patients in the past five years, data with the district health department said. There are around 1 lakh families, or 3 lakh people, registered in Gurgaon under the Ayushman Bharat scheme.

No Mussorie & Nainital entry on NY eve without hotel booking

Dehradun/Mussoorie: Tourists heading towards Mussoorie and Nainital will not be allowed to enter the towns without prior hotel bookings on December 30 and 31. This, officials said, is being done to manage the heavy traffic and tourist influx in the two popular destinations on New Year's Eve.

The decision was taken during a meeting of Uttarakhand police, chaired by state DGP Ashok Kumar. The state police head added that "adequate parking facilities in the two tourist destinations have been made by police to brace for New Year celebrations."

In Mussoorie, cops have prepared a plan to regulate the traffic going towards the town and also on Mall road. Police have also made a 'one-way loop' and parking plan to manage the gridlock.

According to a press note released by the office of the superintendent of police (traffic) Akshay Konde, nine places have been identified for parking vehicles across the town. Entry of vehicles on Mall road, especially on the stretch between Jhoola Ghar and Ritz Cinema, has been completely prohibited from 10am to 10pm. **TNN**

Hry mantri molested me, told me to keep him happy: Coach Charges 'Baseless', Ready For Probe: Sports Minister

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Chandigarh: An athlete and coach alleged Thursday that former Indian hockey captain and Haryana sports minister Sandeep Singh had "inappropriately touched her, praised her figure and asked her to keep him happy" when she met him at his Chandigarh home in September. Singh dismissed the charges as "absolutely false and baseless".

The woman made the allegations at a press conference called by Ellenabad MLA and senior Indian National Lok Dal (INLD) politician Abhay Singh Chautala at the party's office in Chandigarh.

The BJP minister responded with a presser, where he said: "The junior coach was deployed to Jhajjar but she wanted to stay in Panchkula. I had asked her to submit an application to the department and told senior officers to adjust all such players so that their training does not get hampered. There should be an independent probe into this and I am ready for it."

The athlete said she had been in touch with the minis-

ter since June-July and met him for the first time at a technical gym built for international players in Panchkula. Thereafter, according to the woman, Singh contacted her on Instagram, and praised her game and achievements.

"I was happy to be praised by an international player. He later contacted me on Instagram and asked me to talk on Snapchat. He sent his personal ID on Snapchat," she said.

"In September, he called me to his Chandigarh residence, where he asked me to come to his personal room. He touched me inappropri-

ately, praising my figure and body. He then asked me to keep him happy. I pushed him and rushed out of the house. During this process my T-shirt was torn," she alleged.

She said she can't show the chats as Singh communicated on "vanish mode" on Instagram that allows users to send each other disappearing messages and other content.

She said she met the minister again at his office on Wednesday and was told that she had been shifted to Jhajjar. She claimed her career would stall because Jhajjar does not have adequate facilities for a national-level sportsperson.

The athlete said she didn't go to police or inform other authorities because her colleagues advised her against it. Chautala claimed that the athlete contacted him after everyone turned a deaf ear to her pleas. He demanded the minister's dismissal and asked CM Manohar Lal Khattar to order a probe.

The INLD legislator said he had called former CM Bhupinder Singh Hooda of Congress to take up the matter as the woman is from his area.

Amid Cong attack, IB starts probe into Putin-critic death

Koraput/Bhubaneswar: The Intelligence Bureau (IB) began investigating on Thursday the mysterious deaths of Putin critic and Russian businessman-lawmaker Pavel Antov and his co-traveller Bydanov Vladimir in a Rayagada hotel last week, amid Congress swiping at the Odisha government with questions such as why the two Christians were cremated in India and the bodies not sent to their homeland.

A three-member IB team visited the hotel in Rayagada, while the Odisha police crime branch, which is investigating the deaths, sent a seven-member team to Rayagada on Thursday evening to identify and collect evidence.

"The IB team examined CCTV footage, questioned a few of our staff and took a look at the hotel," said an employee. The team then visited Siriguda crematorium where the bodies were cremated.

Sausage tycoon Antov, 65, fell to his death from the third

floor of the hotel last Saturday, two days after Bydanov, 61, died of a possible heart attack in the same hotel.

Congress MP Manish Tewari tweeted a video that questioned the circumstances leading to the deaths and the way things were handled after that. "Russian Oligarch 'War Critic' Off beat hotel... Convenient window... Fall... Death... Colleague died 2 days earlier... same hotel... Both cremated in India... being Christians not buried... Bodies not sent home to Russia... IF THIS IS NOT UNNATURAL THEN DID NOT GO TO LAW SCHOOL @Naveen_Odisha,"

tweeted Tewari.

According to MEA spokesperson Arindam Bagchi, Odisha police are probing the deaths in accordance with Indian law. "We are aware of it... Let's wait for the results of those investigations," Bagchi said.

Questioning of a Russian couple — Panssenko Natalia and her husband Turov Mikhail — and their Indian guide Jitendra Singh, who were with the deceased, continued for the third consecutive day.

The autopsy report of Antov attributed the cause of death to rupture of left pelvis, lungs, liver and spleen leading to neurovascular shock and death. It said the injuries were accidental in nature. It does not talk of external injuries or of suspected alcohol or any intoxicant, unlike in the case of Bydanov.

Bydanov's report said the cause of death can be ascertained after findings of visceral analysis though heart-respiratory failure can't be ruled out. His stomach was filled with a fluid with a peculiar smell like that of opium or ganja.

Hash brownies: NDPS court uses HC's Rhea order, gives baker bail

Mumbai: Granting bail to a 20-year-old baker arrested in June 2021, a special NDPS court relied on the Bombay high court order granting similar relief to actor Rhea Chakraborty in the drugs case relating to the death of actor Sushant Singh Rajput. Accused in separate cases, both women were charged under Section 27A of the NDPS Act (illicit trafficking and harbouring of offenders).

Granting bail to Rhea in 2020, the Bombay HC had said on the applicability of Section 27A that allegations that she spent money in procuring drugs for Rajput did not mean she had financed illicit traffic.

Relying on this order and another in which Rajput's former roommate Siddharth Pitahani were granted bail, the court in the baker's order said it did not think the allegation against her falls under the category of financing illicit traffic or harbouring offenders.

The woman was granted

bail on December 13. In the order, the court said the contraband seized from the woman and her friend is of small quantity and punishment would not be more than 6 months.

The NCB had submitted that on June 12, 2021, it received information that the woman supplied brownies laced with ganja. The NCB caught the woman. It was alleged she had two boxes with ganja brownies. The raiding party then went to a flat and her male friend, also an accused, was found in possession of 35 grams of ganja. The NCB alleged there were 830 grams cakes in boxes seized from the woman.

Dalits gain entry to TN village temple for first time, celebrate

Pudukkottai: Dalit residents of Vengavayal village in Tamil Nadu's Pudukkottai district on Thursday set foot in the Ayyanar temple for the first time in three generations, striking a blow for caste equity days after faecal matter was found in the water tank of the adjoining Dalit hamlet of Iraiur; reports **Gokul Rajendran**.

Escorted by state environment minister Siva V Meyyathan, Pudukkottai collector Kavitha Ramu and officials, a group of Dalit women, men and children entered the shrine alongside devotees from the Agamudaiyar and Mutharaiyar communities for a special puja meant to mark a new beginning for the villages of Muthukadu panchayat.

"Our right to worship at the temple has been upheld after generations. We wish this continues," said M Sindhuja, a woman aspiring to a government job.

Representatives of other communities in the village claimed there was never any discrimination.

K'taka quota sop for Vokkaligas, Lingayats ahead of 2023 polls

Belagavi: The Karnataka government on Thursday decided to create two new categories in the existing reservation matrix for backward communities — Lingayats and Vokkaligas — and has sought a report from the backward classes panel as it looks to "save" from the EWS quota to decide on the quantum of increase for the two communities.

On the last day of the winter session of assembly in Belagavi, the state cabinet decided to shift Vokkaligas and Lingayats to '2C' and '2D' categories, respectively. Vokkaligas and Lingayats were previously classified as 3A and 3B, with 4% and 5% reservation in education and government jobs, respectively. With the cabinet decision, the 3A and 3B categories now stand abolished.

CM Basavaraj Bommai was under pressure as the two communities are the deciding factor on nearly 150 of

the 224 assembly seats.

The cabinet has sought a report from the Karnataka State Permanent Backward Classes Commission suggesting the quantum of reservations to be given to the economically weaker sections in proportionate to their population before increasing the quota of Lingayats and Vokkaligas. In 2019, the Centre had announced 10% quota for EWS under the general category.

"After allocating reservations to EWS in proportion to their population, the government expects to get a pool of 5-6% of the total of 10%, and this will be distributed among Lingayats and Vokkaligas in the new category, in addition to their existing quotas," said JC Madhuswamy, minister of law and parliamentary affairs.

The commission might take about three months to submit the report, and then the government would decide on the quantum of increase in quota, he added.
